Hospital Build Update

We are pleased to share an exciting update about the new hospital building project. The application for the USDA loan was submitted in February! This is one of the big steps that gets us closer to the finish line.

Other developments include:


- The project manager has been hired: David E. Johnson Architect.
- The Christman Company will serve as the construction manager.

• A contractor meeting was held in early February with approximately 70 contractors attending to discuss the project, gain insight into the project details, ask questions, and understand the bidding process.

• Steve Barnett, McKenzie Health System CEO & President, along with architect and project manager David Johnson, attended a Sandusky City Council meeting to request a property split on the new property. This will address a wetland issue on the property, allowing the loan process to move forward without delay.

The loan application is currently with the USDA and we are awaiting loan approval.


